This second theme is later revealed to be a counterpoint to the original fugal subject. The material is derived from the first two bars and a half bar figure that occurs in sequences and responses. A concertino for two oboes and bassoon forms the counterpart to the string concertino of two violins and cello.

He had written several operas, which had been performed to much acclaim in Italy.

The tenth Grand Concerto in D minor has the form a baroque dance suite introduced by a French overture: This phrase and a repeated quaver figure are passed freely between soloists and ripieno in a movement that relies on musical texture. The key of D minor returns in the Concerto, Opus 2, No.

The sombreness of the movement is underlined by the final cadence on the low notes of its statement, it is varied twice, the first time with a quaver walking bass then with the melody itself played in quavers.
