[in wars] aimed not at the conquest but at the utter annihilation of all enemy towns and lands... This danger can ... only be prevented by the air superiority of a single power ... This is the only realistic hope for a lasting peace ... The peaceful organization of the postwar world would rest on a double basis: We cannot afford ... to work on narrow margins, offering temptations to a trial of strength.
